High Mill Growing & Learning Garden

The High Mill Community Growing and Learning Garden is part of a project led by Carluke Development Trust which is in the process of taking the derelict buildings and spaces of Carluke High Mill and is transforming them into a Community Growing and Learning Garden and Heritage Site.

Clydesdale Foodbank is situated on this site. This will allow for the sharing of resources and for some of the produce from the garden to help tackle food poverty and reduce waste.

The garden has been established as an outdoors learning and growing space which is led by the Community Gardener and a range of volunteers. Groups and individuals are encouraged to use the spaces and are directly supported or mentored by the Community Gardener. Examples include the Community Gardener working with the Cubs group. They learned about soil, tomatoes and edible petals and were encouraged to craft items for display in the Quiet Garden.
